Foreword

This document summarizes various data from the 2022 USDA Census of Agriculture and shows Tennessee's national ranking in selected enterprises/categories. While it does not include every enterprise/category reported in the Census, most livestock and crop enterprises/categories are included. A great attempt has been made by the authors to use the same enterprise/category titles and descriptors used in the Census...any variation from the terms used in the Census is intended for clarification. Specific definitions of terms used in the Census can be found in the Census literature – a glossary of terms is not included in this document. For clarification in some tables, the use of the abbreviation '(*) ND' represents data not disclosed/published in the Census.

From soybeans and cotton to sorghum syrup and poultry, Tennessee agriculture is diverse. This publication summarizes data from the 2022 USDA Census of Agriculture for more than 90 farm enterprises/categories and shows Tennessee's corresponding national ranking. The data shows that Tennessee ranked number one in only one category: Acres of Sorghum for Syrup with 101 acres. Tennessee ranked second among all other states in 8 categories:

- Number of farms with other poultry (64 farms)
- Number of farms with sales from other poultry (24 farms)
- Gallons of Sorghum for Syrup (9,623 gallons)
- Acres of Switchgrass (458 acres)
- Number of Farms with Hemp for Floral (CBD) (143 farms)
- Number of Farms with Rapeseed (7 farms)
- Number of Farms with Geese Sales (111 farms)
- Acres of Mulberries (32 Acres)

Tennessee ranked in the top 5 of 62 categories and in the top 10 of 610 categories. Table 1 lists the areas where Tennessee ranked in the top 5 nationwide while Table 2 shows the various enterprises where Tennessee ranks in the top 6 to 10.
